This year we've taken almost 100 learners through our famous Mission to Mars work experience programme. Students from our Gateway into Tech, Truro College and even virtually from Aberdeen independent school attend the sessions to learn the skills required to work for a real-life tech company.

Successful Mission to Mars alumni have gone on to take up software developer roles in local tech companies. We thank our members and volunteers for their continued support on Mission to Mars.

This year, Robert and Garry even took Mission To Mars to <u>Bristol Tech Week for the first time!</u> They spoke about the work experience and team building opportunites that we can offer and challenged attendees from all over Bristol and the South West to do some live coding with our Mars Rovers.

It doesn't stop there! In 2023 we're offering <u>four</u> brand new work experiences. Throughout next year we will be able to call upon our partners within the sector to help us build interactive and exciting work experiences for students.

Training

This year we've delivered more than 61 hours of Training sessions. From Behaviour Driven Development to Data modelling. Some of these sessions are delivered weekly as part of our Training Club Programme and some are part of one-off sessions. In total we had 600+ attendees at our training sessions in 2022.

Gateway into Tech

Our successful, self lead learning for people who would like to reskill for a career in tech and software. This year Mission to Mars ran with Gateway into Tech and involved our member companies joining for talks and direct involvement. This year we've had almost 100 applications and 13 candidates on this programme. With almost 40% going on to paid employment with local and national companies.

Through the Software Cornwall Jobs board, the Cornish Tech Jobs newsletter and our social media channels, we've helped local tech companies to recruit over 100 new employees this year.

Mission to Mars was shortlisted for another award at the Tech South West Awards this year. Unfortunately, we didn't win but we had a strong presence at the awards with the Mission To Mars Space Rovers set up for fellow attendees to demo. Not to mention Tec Girls who walked away with multiple awards on the night!

We exhibited at the women and girls Take Up Space event held at Truro and Penwith College in November. It was a huge success, demonstrating our Mission to Mars Space Rovers and introducing how to code. We were proud to be a part of raising awareness outside of the curriculum of potential careers in tech.
